Reglan Public School Fete

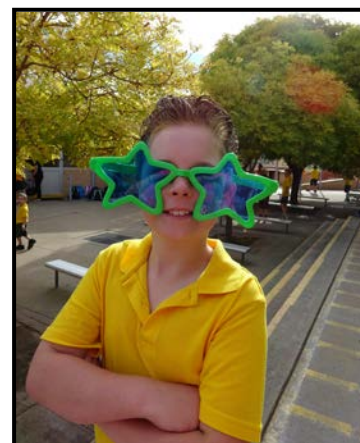
