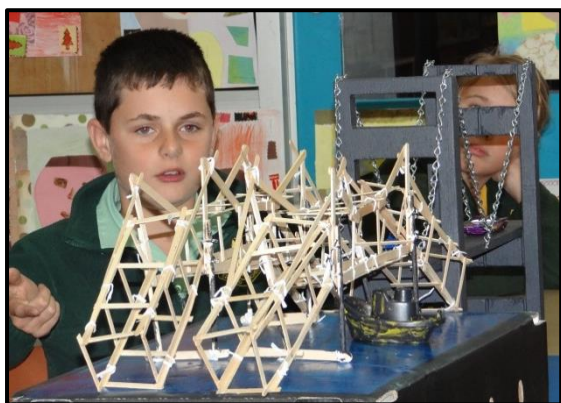

### OTHER SCHOOL NEWS

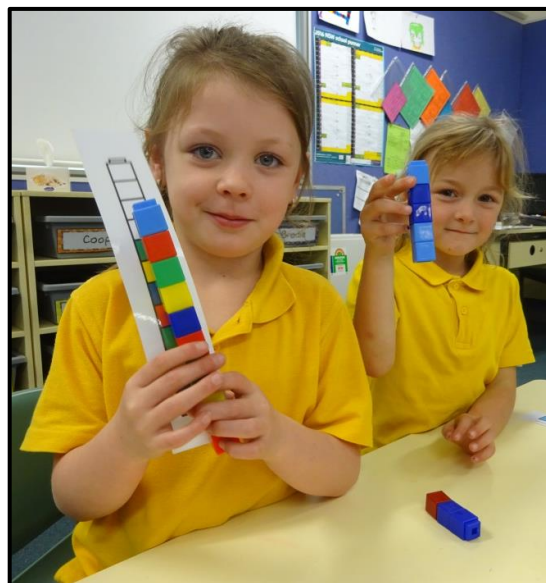
On Friday, 10<sup>th</sup> June, Stage 3 students went to Kelso High School to watch a play by the Year 10 and 11 students.
